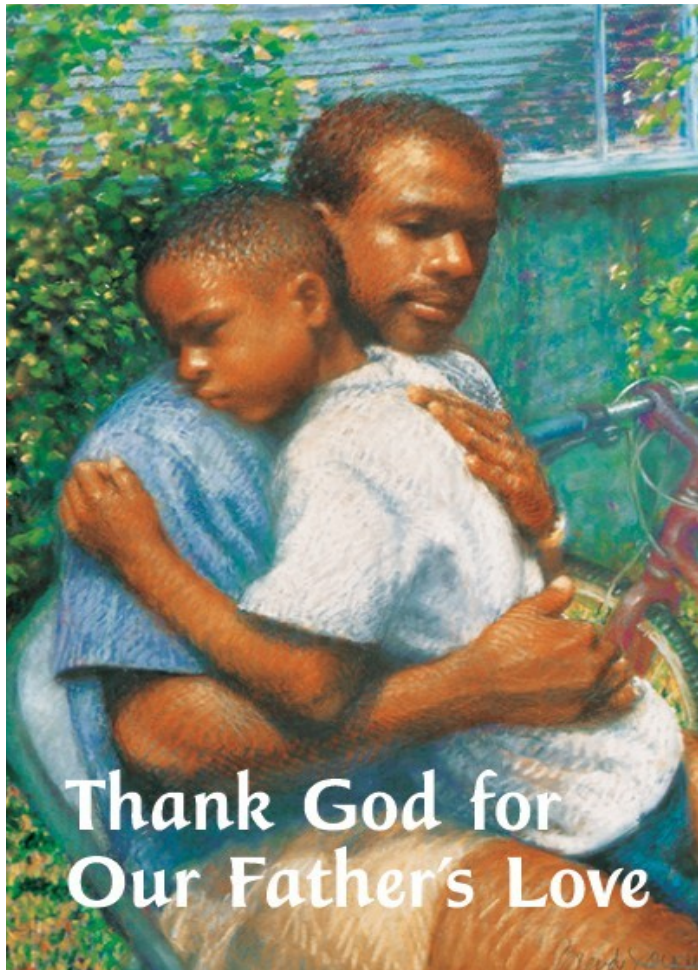

"Reaping God's Justice"

Lesson: Luke 16:19-31

GOLDEN TEXT:

"Son, remember that thou in thy lifetime receivedst thy good things, and likewise Lazarus evil things: but now he is comforted, and thou art tormented." — Luke 16:25

TODAY'S AIM:

"To learn some key details about what happens after death."

INTRODUCING THE LESSON:

While not all agree, it seems the Lord Jesus is telling this story not as a parable but as a true account. It involves "a certain rich man" (Luke 16:19), not a created illustration to teach a point of truth. Although his name is tactfully not given, the Lord Jesus, by the clarity and certainly of the story as told, lets us know that He could have given his name. He was a real person.

The rich man had it made. He lived in luxury. However, he had the same problem every person does: one day he would die. Opportunities in life abounded, but they would end. Lazarus had nothing—no opportunities—and he also would die. We are captured by this story because it hits us where we live and makes us wonder about many things.

PRACTICAL POINTS:

1. When we have the opportunity, we should help those who are in need (Luke 16:19-21).
2. When we are in turmoil, the slightest gesture of kindness can be a great relief (Luke 16:22-24).
3. One day, all people will be held accountable for their actions (Luke 16:25-26).
4. We should tell our loved ones about Jesus while we still can (Luke 16:27-28).
5. The word of God contains everything we need to know about salvation (Luke 16:29-30).

CONCLUDING THE LESSON:

Remember, this is a story about where people will spend eternity, which is determined by the decisions we make in this life. We cannot do anything for the condition of others, other than give our testimony to the glorious gospel of Christ. Ultimately, we must leave it up to God as to what He will do to reach unbelievers. God may give extraordinary proofs of the truth of the gospel if He so chooses.

However, Scripture points out that "the just shall live by faith" (Romans 1:17). We are asked to believe God because He is God, not because of "proof." one day all people will be convinced, but by then it will be too late, just as it was with the rich man. As much as we can, should we not explain this whole story to the unsaved? Let us not give in to the modern, liberal idea that there is no hell and eternal torment, which is clearly at odds with the teachings of the Lord Jesus.
